1. Grew up in Westchester County, NY and attended Iona Prep in New Rochelle.
2. While attending Fordham University, he was trained in the art of play-by-play by the legendary Marty Glickman. As a senior at Fordham in 1992, was named the best college radio play-by-play announcer in the tri-state area – the prize was calling the 3rd quarter of a Knicks radio broadcast on WFAN alongside Walt “Clyde” Frazier.
3. Started his career as an intern for the NY Giants radio broadcast in 1991. Today he calls the play-by-play of the Giants pre-season radio broadcasts.
4. Started with the Nets as a studio producer in 1992 and has worked on the broadcast ever since, eventually becoming the full-time radio play-by-play voice in 2001.
5. He has served as a TV play-by-play voice for NBC during the last three Olympic games, calling basketball and handball.
6. Has been calling the radio play-by-play of NFL games for Compass Media since the Network’s first NFL broadcast in 2008. Has also called NCAA Football and Basketball as well as MLB games for Compass over the years.
7. Started noticing symptoms of FSHD during his college years and was diagnosed in his early twenties.
8. Married his Brooklyn born and raised wife Laura in 2002. Their son, Christopher, was born in 2004.
9. They began the Chris Carrino Foundation for FSHD in 2011
10. Enjoys cooking and Pearl Jam – often at the same time.
